THE SINGERS of Libera, aged seven to sixteen, attend schools in London, and come from a variety of backgrounds. Familiar to audiences across the world, the boys have an original sound, which is at once both ancient and modern. Their distinctive white robes symbolise the traditional origins of their style yet their music reaches across the generations to a new mainstream audience. Libera's success in album charts around the world bears witness to the extraordinary appeal of this unique 'boy band' and they have attracted an enthusiastic fan base in many countries, particularly in the US & Canada, Russia, UK, Japan, China, the Philippines, Taiwan, Singapore and South Korea.

Libera is known to British audiences through

TV appearances and staged concerts at a variety of venues from the South Bank in London to concert halls and cathedrals across the country. Libera have made many television appearances including BBC-TV's 'Last Choir Standing', on which the boys were featured as guests. They were winners of the Saturday night show 'When Will I Be Famous' and had a whole documentary devoted to them on BBC-TV's 'Songs of Praise'. Other TV/Radio appearances have included 'BBC Breakfast' and the 'Chris Evans Show'. The boys are regularly to be heard on Classic FM, and last Christmas scored the top classical song download at iTunes.

In the US & Canada, Libera are known through their concert tours and TV appearances

including nationwide PBS specials, NBC 'Today' show and 'The Tonight Show.' Libera boys were the only British artists to perform at the Papal Mass at the climax of Pope Benedict XVI's first visit to the USA - singing to a congregation of 65,000 at New York's Yankee Stadium. They sang a tribute to Beach Boys Brian Wilson at the Kennedy Center Honours and have travelled across North America several times, appearing in venues as diverse as the Crystal Cathedral in California, St Ignatius church in San Francisco, the St Louis Basilica, St Paul and Minneapolis cathedrals, the Moody church in Chicago, the Riverside Church in NYC and other venues both secular and sacred from Texas to Toronto. They are top artists on the PBS network which frequently screens Libera's 'Christmas in Ireland' concert in Armagh Cathedral and a special performance in Washington DC filmed at the National Shrine.

During their recent European tour, Libera joined the throng of pilgrims attending World Youth Day in Poland gathered to join with

Pope Francis. The boys performed to packed crowds in Krakov including their largest ever live appearance singing to over 1.5 million at the vigil event. In the same tour they made their debut in Germany at the Schoenstatt shrine near Koblenz.

In South East Asia, the sounds of Libera are frequently heard in mainstream TV and radio programmes and their CD's ride high in the classical and pop charts of countries like Japan, South Korea, Taiwan, Singapore and the Philippines. In Japan they performed the Christmas music for the world's largest Universal Studios theme park in Osaka to over 10,000 and, as a reward for also singing their television advert the boys enjoyed a day of free rides!







LIBERA BOYS SAY ...

We do Libera because we really like it – it's special. We don't have to do it - it's our hobby

Our white robes are really old and ancient – but we are all modern. Our concerts make us all look like X-Factor or Lady Gaga but with us singing

Sometimes you get really moved when you are performing, and it makes you go all tingly

In the old abbey, the shadows of all the massive arches and shapes were all around us, with our hoods up. It was really cool – like we were in history

One of the best bits of being in Libera is being with your mates who all like doing the same thing, and we all get on really well

Once you start to sing, all fears and butterflies leave you and the enjoyment and

thrill kicks in and I absolutely love it and forget everything else.

The travelling and filming is fun but even if we didn't go anywhere I'd still want to do it because I just love singing

During performances we always wear our white robes. They are actually quite comfy. When we sing in colder places it is quite useful to be able to slip your arms out of the sleeves and have them closer to your body to keep warm

I think you can feel awesome when you sing the Latin words in services & concerts, especially the big ones in cathedrals, it really makes you feel... wow

When I sing I don't think about anything else, it just fills my head with music - I would do it 25 hours a day!
