Tonight's concert begins with the evening hymn 'Glory to thee my God this night' sung to a tune written by Thomas Tallis nearly 500 years ago. Many of the compositions we are singing have similarly ancient roots.

Several are based on the plainsong style of the monasteries which dates back over a thousand years.

'Libera' was the first song written for Libera, and, of course, gave the group its name. It uses a single line of plainsong with many overlapping tunes and harmony which encompass the full range of the boys' voices.

Other items like 'Salva Me' also reflect the mood of the ancient plainchant.

Some Libera songs are arrangements of well-known classical works:

'Lacrymosa' is based on 'Aquarium' from the 'Carnival of the Animals' by the French composer, Saint Saens for instance. We have added our own melody which weaves around the atmospheric chords. A movement from Beethoven's 7th Symphony forms the basis for 'Sacris Solemnis' and 'Sanctus' is built on the wonderful 'Canon' by Pachelbel, and includes some of Libera's highest treble notes.

The music of the second half ranges from the ecstatically optimistic 'Stay with me' to the melancholy 'Going Home' and the concert finishes with the climactic 'I am the Day'.

At the end of April, **Libera** sang several songs as part of the Papal Mass event at the climax of Pope Benedict XVI's first visit to the USA. Performing to a capacity congregation of 60,000 at New York's Yankee Stadium, Libera were the only British artists to take part in this historical event.

The appearance was a fitting climax to their US Angel Voices tour (including a performance at New York's Riverside Church), capping a season in which the ensemble closed the Kennedy Center Honours in December 2007 before a star-studded audience that included President and Mrs. George W. Bush, Brian Wilson, Diana Ross, Martin Scorsese, Steve Martin and Robert de Niro. The last few months also saw the release of Libera's fourth CD for EMI Classics—'New Dawn'; the completion of their third tour of Japan and Korea; several appearances on BBC TV—including being voted top act on the BBC-I talent show 'When will I be famous' - and the filming of a concert in Leiden, Holland. After the U.S. release of Angel Voices – Libera in Concert on CD and DVD in October 2007, the choir's performances were broadcast on PBS, the national Public Broadcasting Service.

Libera has an enthusiastic fan base in many countries, particularly the United States, Great Britain, Japan and Korea, where their previous CDs have enjoyed great success in the charts. The ensemble's performances have a strong visual style, the boys appearing in long, flowing white robes on imaginatively lit stages.

The boys who make up the band have been described as 'normal' and 'ordinary' but as their recordings and performances demonstrate, the music they produce is truly extraordinary. Through their involvement in Libera, they have travelled the world, recorded movie soundtracks and CDs and served as backing singers to mega-stars. But, as one of the boys said, "The travelling and filming is fun but even if we didn't go anywhere I'd still want to do it because I just love singing."
